## **ICMR – NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF NUTRITION**

### **Vision**

To create scientifically trained human resources in the area of Applied Nutrition who will make a positive contribution to society.

### **Mission**

To equip post-graduate students with knowledge and skills in the multi-disciplinary area of Applied Nutrition, thereby enabling them to contribute to the field of nutrition.

### **M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition)**

The ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition (NIN) has reached a remarkable milestone of completing 100 years of exemplary service to the nation with special emphasis on overcoming the nutritional deficiency disorders. The NIN looks forward to recast its focus with renewed commitment not just to nutrition science, but also for building a healthy nation. Systematic training programmes have been initiated to impart training in the current concepts of nutritional science and their application for promoting public health. This was initiated by introducing training programmes and certificate courses. A nine-month M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) Postgraduate Programme was initiated in 1968 to create skilled human resources in nutritional sciences to address the nutritional problems in India. This course was initially open to sponsored candidates and later considering the usefulness of this programme and the demand, it was upgraded to a full-time two-year M.Sc. programme in Applied Nutrition in 2009 (originally affiliated to Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada). The affiliation was shifted to Dr. Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal, in the State of Telangana after bifurcation. The students who passed out from the course are employed in teaching and research positions across the globe and continue to contribute to the dissemination of the knowledge of nutritional sciences as young ambassadors of the National Institute of Nutrition. From the academic year 2020-21 the M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) course will be offered under MoU with Osmania University, Hyderabad.

### **About the Programme**

The M.Sc. Applied Nutrition programme of NIN will be conducted under MoU with the Osmania University, Hyderabad from the academic year 2020-21. The program will follow Semester pattern and Choice Based Credit System as per the guidelines issued by UGC. The curriculum has been framed in consultation with renowned academicians, researchers and clinicians in various specialties of nutritional sciences and is designed with an application-oriented approach.

## **Objectives of the M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) Programme**

- To develop in-depth knowledge and understanding of the various applications of nutritional sciences in public health and clinical settings to address nutritional deficiencies.
- To gain knowledge and skills needed for planning and management of community and public health nutrition programmes implemented by the Government and NGOs.
- To acquire skills in nutritional assessment and nutritional planning for application of theoretical concepts in field settings.
- To acquire research and scholarly skills and specific skills needed for entrepreneurship to increase employability.

## **Career options**

After the completion of this course, candidates will be able to take up careers in the following areas:

1. Teachers/Professors- as faculty teaching the science of nutrition and dietetics in colleges and universities.
2. Nutritionists in government's health departments, schools, colleges and office cafeterias for planning nutritional regimens.
3. Researchers in Government established Laboratories and Institutes.
4. Clinical Dietitians/Nutritionists in Hospitals, outpatient clinics and as private consultants.
5. Nutritionists in Food Industries and Pharma companies.
6. Nutrition educators/counselors/advisors and extension workers.
7. Nutritionists in gymnasiums and sports facilities.

## **Eligibility**

Candidates seeking admission into the two-year M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) course must have passed in one of the following Under Graduate courses viz., B.Sc. (Nursing), MBBS or B.Sc. with one of the following subjects namely Nutrition, Foods & Nutrition, Home Science (with specialization in Food & Nutrition), Bio-Chemistry, Zoology, Applied Nutrition and Public Health, Clinical Nutrition & Dietetics, Food Science or Nutrition & Dietetics. In addition, the candidate should possess a minimum of 55% aggregate marks in the qualifying examination and SC/ST candidates should possess a minimum of 50% aggregate marks in the qualifying examination. Considering the prevailing situation due to the COVID-19 lockdown, candidates who are appearing for the

qualifying exam in the year 2020 and are awaiting their results are also eligible to apply. However, they should submit the relevant certificates at the time of counselling.

**Note:** If a candidate is found to have concealed any information regarding the eligibility criteria, the registration will be cancelled. Further, disciplinary action will be taken by the concerned authorities against the candidate.

### **Scheme of Examination of the Course**

1. English will be the medium of instruction and examination.
2. For each subject, the total marks for theory are 100 (80 external and 20 internal assessment), and for practical the total marks are 50. For dissertation and project/internship, marks will be based on report evaluation, presentations and viva-voce as applicable and decided by the committee.
3. The continuous evaluation shall be based on factors such as participation in case studies, group activities, class attendance, class tests, mid-term test, assignments and viva-voce.
4. The duration of the end semester final examination for each theory course will be three hours.

### Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by the student in all the courses taken by the student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses earned by the student.

Calculation of SGPA

$$SGPA(S_i) = \frac{\sum C_i * G_i}{\sum C_i}$$

Where  $C_i$  is the number of credits of the  $i^{th}$  course and  $G_i$  is the grade point scored by the student in the  $i^{th}$  course.

Calculation of CGPA

The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses cleared by the student over all the semesters of a programme

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum C_i * S_i}{\sum C_i}$$

Where  $S_i$  is the SGPA of the  $i^{th}$  semester and  $C_i$  is the total number of credits in that semester

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts

### Award of Degree

A student shall be awarded the degree on the following conditions:

- (i) He/she must have registered himself/herself to undergo the chosen course of study; completed the internship and project report specified in the curriculum of his/ her program within the stipulated time, and secured the minimum credits and CGPA prescribed for award of the concerned degree.
- (ii) There are no dues outstanding in the student's name to be paid to the Institute/ University.



- (iii) No disciplinary action should be pending against the student.
- (iv) The student should have earned minimum credits (i.e. total credits offered in the program - number of credits, not exceeding 6 credits).

The above degree will be awarded with distinction, if a student has earned a minimum CGPA of 7.50 with pass in all subjects in the first attempt.

The maximum permissible period for completing the program is 4 years from the date of registration. However, if a student fails to do so, he/she may be permitted to register again for the program after obtaining the requisite approval from the concerned authorities of NIN and OU.

### **Provision for Reappearing**

Reappearing in examinations related to all courses viz. theory/practical/viva will be permitted. The reexaminations will be scheduled along with the end semester examinations.

### **Attendance**

Candidates once admitted are required to have not less than 75% of attendance in lectures (and practical wherever applicable). The Vice-chancellor, on the specific recommendation of the Principal/Head of the Department, may condone the deficiency in attendance to the extent of 10% on medical grounds, subject to production of satisfactory Medical Certificate and on payment of the prescribed condonation fee. No admission will be made after the expiry of four (4) weeks from the date of commencement of instruction.

## SYLLABUS AND PATTERN FOR ENTRANCE TEST

The candidates need to appear for the entrance test, which is based on the MCQ (objective type) to be conducted by National Institute of Nutrition, Hyderabad. The Entrance Test will be for **100 marks** and will be of **90 minutes duration**. The test shall consist of 3 parts and the marks are allotted as shown below.

Note: The syllabus for the entrance examination is of graduation level and the question paper will be in English.

Minimum qualifying marks in the Entrance Test are as follows:

1. 45 marks for SC and ST candidates
2. 50 marks for all other candidates

Merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the Entrance Test. In case of equality of marks in the Entrance Test, the total percentage of the marks in the qualifying examination (upto two decimal places) shall be taken into consideration for fixing the merit of candidates. If the entrance test marks and the percentage of marks in qualifying examination are equal, the age of the candidate shall be taken into consideration and older candidates will be placed higher in merit. The marks of the candidates in order of merit and in order of Hall Tickets number will be displayed on the website of ICMR-NIN ([www.nin.res.in](http://www.nin.res.in)).

Note: If the candidate fails to submit the marks memos from first to final year of qualifying examination, the minimum passing marks shall be taken into consideration.

#### **NUMBER OF SEATS**

- i. The total No. of sanctioned Seats is 20. Out of the 20 seats available, one third of the seats are reserved for candidates from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh State (State quota) and the remaining seats are reserved for the applicants outside Telangana and Andhra Pradesh (Central Quota). Further details will be presented in Annexure-I of the prospectus.
- ii. The distribution of seats under Central quota will be implemented as per the rules of the Central Govt. vide No. DL-(N) 04/007/2006-08 dated 3rd Jan 2007. Accordingly, 15%, 7%, and 27% seats are reserved for SC, ST and OBC candidates respectively.
- iii. The procedure indicated in Annexure-III to G.O.P.No. 646, Education dated 10-7-1979 shall be followed in the selections of the candidates. 15%, 6% and 29% seats are reserved for SC, ST and BC (A-7%, B-10%, C-1%, D-7% and E-4%) candidates respectively as followed by the net group reservation.

**Note:** To claim reservation under the categories candidate should produce a certificate issued by a Revenue official not below the rank of District Revenue Authority.

#### **SCRUTINY OF APPLICATIONS AND ISSUE OF HALL TICKETS**

- i. Applications under both the Central quota as well as the State (Telangana & Andhra Pradesh) Quota will be received and scrutinized at NIN, Hyderabad as per the regulations under the chairmanship of the Course Co- Coordinator. A representative of OU may be present at the time of scrutiny of applications.
- ii. The list of eligible candidates will be put up on NIN's website ([www.nin.res.in](http://www.nin.res.in)) and on the notice boards of NIN.
- iii. The Course Coordinator at NIN will act as Chief Superintendent of the Entrance Test and will upload hall tickets of the eligible Candidates on the website.
- iv. The admission will be done through Counseling at NIN by the committee appointed by Director, NIN consisting of at least one representative from OU.
- v. The seats under the Central quota will be filled up first and vacant seats, if any, will be offered to the eligible candidates from the State Quota and vice-versa, and based on merit.

## SELECTION OF THE CANDIDATES

- i. The Selection Committee consisting of the members from NIN and OU will select the candidates.
- ii. Entrance Examination will be conducted if the number of applications for admission to the course is more than fifty. If the number of applications received is less than fifty, NIN will not conduct entrance test and all the eligible applicants will be selected for admission based on the merit in the qualifying degree examination.
- iii. The selected candidates who have qualified the entrance examination and fulfilled the criteria for counseling including reservation policy will be uploaded on NIN's website and will also be communicated by email.
- iv. After finishing the admission procedure, the list of selected candidates admitted by NIN with all Original Certificates and university fee will be sent to the Registrar, OU for approval of admissions.

## RESERVATION

Local and Non-Local Candidates:

- i. Admission to 85% of the available seats in every course shall be reserved in favour of the local candidates in relation to the local area in respect of O.U. subject to community and other reservations in force (Detailed in Annexure-II).
- ii. The remaining 15% of the seats which are open to local and non-locals shall be filled up subject to similar reservation as applicable to 85% local candidates (Detailed in Annexure-II).

## HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The hostel is well equipped with furniture, Wi-Fi and has LCD television besides other facilities. The hostel rooms are spacious and well furnished. The hostel also includes a dining facility and students are not allowed to cook in their hostel rooms. It provides all the students a safe and comfortable environment. It is a "Zero tolerance for ragging" and a "No Smoking Zone".

The students who secure admission at NIN are eligible for hostel accommodation. The hostel seats are reserved as per the government rules for SC/ST/OBC.

Admission to the hostel will be given as per the merit and the following categorization:

**Category A:** 95% of seats will be allotted to the students whose parents are not residing in or around Hyderabad. A proof of residence has to be submitted for the same.

**Category B:** 5% of the seats will be allotted to the students whose parents are residing in or around Hyderabad but 20 kms or more from the NIN. A proof of residence has to be submitted for the same.

**Admission to hostel will be allowed if applied for at the time of submitting application form for admission to the course. Candidates are requested to send application on separate form available in hostel office, along with the application for admission.**

Hostel accommodation in subsequent year of the academic course is not assured. Any candidate not fulfilling the attendance requirement during the current academic year will be denied the hostel seat in the next academic session.

## DOCUMENTS TO BE ENCLOSED WHILE SUBMITTING APPLICATION FORM

All prospective candidates are required to fill in the application form and also submit the following documents:

1. Original DD or proof of Online transfer/NEFT transaction for Rs. 3000/- (for OC/OBC/BC) & Rs. 2700/- (for SC/ST) towards application fee.
2. Clear and visible self-attested photocopies of all marks statements from 1<sup>st</sup> to Final year/semester of qualifying exam (Candidates who are appearing for the qualifying exam and are awaiting their results may also apply however the relevant certificates should be produced at the time of counseling).
3. Self-attested copy of the Internship Certificate mentioning date of commencement and completion of Internship wherever applicable.
4. Self-attested copy of Provisional or Original Degree Certificate of qualifying exam (Candidates who are appearing for the qualifying exam and are awaiting their results may also apply however the relevant certificates should be produced at the time of counseling).
5. Self-attested Copies of Bonafide Certificates from X standard to qualifying examination.
6. Self-attested copy of X class memo or equivalent certificate as proof of age.
7. For applicants applying under the state quota and have not studied the qualifying examination in the state, he/she should submit the following certificates as per regulation in Annexure-I & II whichever is applicable to the applicant.
  - a. 10 Years Residence Certificate of the candidate in the State of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh (OR)
  - b. 10 Years Residence Certificate of either of the Parents/Spouse (Certificate of relationship also shall be enclosed).
8. Candidates who are applying under reservation category should attach the relevant Social Status/Caste Certificate.
9. Candidates claiming eligibility as Local (State quota) should furnish relevant certificates in support of their claim.
10. Candidates who have studied in the state of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh have to attach the following.
  - a. If the candidate has studied in any educational institution, study/ bonafide certificate from IX to degree (Govt. ZPH/Private School or College) should be submitted.
  - b. A candidate who has studied in 2 or more institutions in various places in Telangana including Andhra Pradesh, study bonafide certificate from IX to degree (Govt./ZPH/Private School or College) in those places should be submitted.
  - c. A candidate who has not studied a class in any school/institution, a residence certificate for that period only should be submitted.
  - d. Candidates who have not studied in any school/ college in the state of Telangana/Andhra Pradesh, but resided in Telangana including Andhra Pradesh with private study in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh for seven years with residence certificate mentioning the period of residence preceding the qualifying examination (6th to Inter) by the candidate claiming eligibility as a local by virtue of residence should be submitted.
11. Candidates who have studied in the institutions outside the State of Telangana/Andhra Pradesh have to submit Bonafide certificates of school, Intermediate/plus two and Degree education.

## **CERTIFICATES TO BE SUBMITTED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION**

Candidates called for admission must be present in person and should submit all the ORIGINAL certificates listed below, along with two sets of photocopies.

- i. Degree certificate (or Provisional Certificate if Degree Certificate is not yet issued as per rules) of qualifying examination.
- ii. Memoranda of Marks (Consolidated and yearwise/semesterwise) of the qualifying degree examination.
- iii. Proof of Local / Non-Local candidates, according to rules in force. Those who have studied Intermediate and Degree courses as regular students need to submit only the Bonafide certificates from the colleges where they studied Intermediate and Degree courses. In case, there is a break in the four consecutive years preceding the qualifying examination, the candidates must submit Bonafide certificate of 9th and 10th class. Non-local candidates should submit i) a residence certificate for 10 years of either of the parents from M.R.O. or ii) employee certificate from the employer.
- iv. Original Migration Certificate issued by the concerned university where last studied.
- v. Community, Nativity and Date of Birth Certificate for S.C/S.T./B.C., candidates as per G.O.M.S. No. 58 Social Welfare (J) Department dated 12-5-1997.
- vi. Service Certificate and No-objection Certificate from the employer, in case of employed candidates.
- vii. Required Fee.

**Note:** The Admission will be based on the Entrance test and the student should have passed the Qualifying Examination in all the subjects without any backlogs and produce all the original certificates at the time of counseling.

Tuition fees should be remitted at the time of joining through “Demand Draft” in favor of “Director, NIN” or online bank transfer/NEFT transaction in favour of “Director, NIN” A/c No. 52020520463; IFSC: SBIN0020082; payable at State Bank of India (SBI), NIN Branch, Lallaguda, SECUNDERABAD 500017.

## **CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION**

- i. If any candidate is found to secure admission on the basis of false information with respect to age, subject, percentage of marks, special categories etc., his/her admission will be cancelled and punitive action will be initiated.
- ii. Candidates are not permitted to pursue more than one course, at any point of time. If such cases are detected, the admission of the candidate in both the courses will be cancelled at any time.
- iii. Students who fail in the 1<sup>st</sup> year Examination in the course and are seeking re-admission will be treated as fresh applicants for the purpose of admission.

## ANNEXURE-I

### I. RESERVATIONS FOR CENTRAL QUOTA

- A. All candidates are eligible for central quota except the candidates of Telangana (TS) and Andhra Pradesh (AP). Candidates who are eligible to appear for Entrance Test either as Local or Non-Local of Telangana & Andhra Pradesh are not eligible to seek admission for the Central Quota seats. Candidates seeking admission under Central Quota shall produce a certificate from a Revenue Official not below the rank of District Revenue Authority from the state from which he/she belongs and claims Nativity.
- B. The distribution of seats under Central quota will be implemented as per the rules of the Central Govt. vide No. DL-(N) 04/007/2006-08 dated 3rd Jan 2007. Accordingly, 15%, 7%, and 27% seats are reserved for SC, ST and OBC candidates respectively. To claim reservation under the above categories candidate should produce a certificate issued by a Revenue official not below the rank of District Revenue Authority.

**Note:** If the candidates from outside the state are not available such seats will be filled up by the candidates of TS and AP (Local and Non-Local) as per the old regulations on merit basis.

### II. RESERVATIONS FOR STATE QUOTA

- A. These seats for M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) Course conducted by NIN is considered as non-statewide course.
- B. Admission to 85% of the available seats shall be reserved in favour of local candidates in relation to the local area. While determining 85% in favour of local candidates any fraction of seat will be counted as one as per the Presidential Order.
- C. The procedure indicated in Annexure-III to G.O.P.No. 646, Education dated 10-7-1979 will be followed in the selections of the candidates. 15%, 6% and 29% seats are reserved for SC, ST and BC (A-7%, B-10%, C-1%, D-7% and E-4%) candidates respectively as followed by the net group reservation.



## ANNEXURE-II

### RULES OF ADMISSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ANDHRA PRADESH EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSION) ORDER 1974.

I. Admission to 85% of the available seats in every course of study provided by the Osmania University, shall be reserved in favour of LOCAL CANDIDATES in relation to the LOCAL AREA in respect of the Osmania University subject to community and other reservations in force.

#### A. LOCAL AREA:

- The part of the Telangana State comprising the Districts of Adilabad, Bhadrachalam, Hyderabad, Jagtial, Jangaon, Jayashankar, Jogulamba, Kamareddy, Karimnagar, Khammam, Komaram Bheem, Mahabubabad, Mahabubnagar, Mancherial, Medak, Medchal–Malkajgiri, Nagarkurnool, Nalgonda, Nirmal, Nizamabad, Peddapalli, Rajanna Sircilla, Ranga Reddy, Sangareddy, Siddipet, Suryapet, Vikarabad, Wanaparthy, Warangal Rural, Warangal Urban, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri (Osmania University and Kakatiya University area) shall be regarded as local area for the purpose of admission.
- The part of the Andhra Pradesh State comprising the Districts of Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, East Godavari, West Godavari, Krishna, Guntur and Prakasam (Andhra University and Nagarjuna University area), Ananthapur, Kurnool, Chittoor, Kadapa and Nellore (S.V. University /S.K.University area) shall be regarded as the local area for the purpose of admission.

#### B. LOCAL CANDIDATE:

1. A candidate for admission to any course of study will be regarded as a Local Candidate in relation to local area:
  - a) If he has studied in an educational institution or educational institutions in such local area for a period of not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination or,
  - b) Where, during the whole or any part of the four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in any educational institution if he has resided in that local area for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared.
2. A candidate for admission to any course of study who is not regarded as a local candidate under sub-paragraph (1) in relation to any local area shall:
  - a) If he/she has studied in an educational institution in the State for a period of not less than seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she will appear

- or, as the case may be first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination be regarded as a local candidate in relation to
- i) Such local area where he/she has studied for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years, or
  - ii) Where the periods of study in two or more local areas are equal, such local area where he/she has studied last in such equal periods; or
- b) If, during the whole or any part of the seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she appeared, or as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he/she has not studied in the educational institution in any local area, but has resided in the State during the whole of the said period of seven years be regarded as a local candidate in relation to.
- i) Such local area where he/she has resided for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years: or,
  - ii) Where the periods of his/her residence in two or more local areas are equal, such local area where he/she has resided last in such equal periods.
3. The remaining 15% of the available seats, which are open to local and non-local, will be filled up subject to similar reservation as applicable to 85% local candidates as below:
- a) All candidates who have studied in a recognized educational institution or institutions in the State for a period of not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which they appeared or as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination, or where during the whole or any part of such four consecutive academic years, if they have not studied in any educational institutions, if they have resided in the State for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination.
  - b) Candidates who have resided in the State for a total of ten years excluding periods of study outside the State, or either of whose parents have resided in the State for a total period of ten years excluding the periods of employment outside the state.
  - c) Candidates who are children of parents who are in employment of this State or Central Government, Public Sector Corporations; Local Bodies, Universities and other similar quasi-public institutions within the state.
  - d) Candidates who are spouses of those in the employment of this State or Central Government, Public Sector Corporations; Local Bodies, Universities and Educational Institutions recognized by the Government, a University or other competent authority and other similar quasi-public Institutions within the State.
  - e) Candidates who are employees in State, Central Govt. undertakings, Public Sector Corporations, Local Bodies, Universities and other similar quasi-public institutions within the state.
